Look out for the posters on our school notice board.

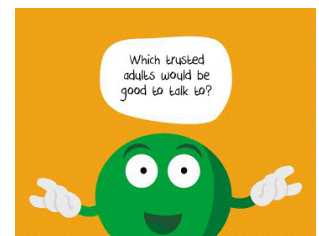
